My Sister Martha E. King, who married John E. King, both of whom are dead, they left surviving them the following children, and heirs at law; - Julia H. Bowman, a daughter who intermarried with William Upton Bowman, and who live at Germantown Montgomery County, Maryland, Carrie Purdum a daughter who intermarried with Reverdy Purdum, who also live in the City of Baltimore, Mary L. Smith a daughter, who intermarried with one Herbert Smith, and who live who live on the State of Ohio at Oakwood, a suburb of Dayton, Reginald W. King, a son whose wife's name is Ida King, and who live at Monrovia, Frederick County, Maryland; Essie Watkins a daughter who is a widow, and who also lives at Monrovia, Edna Aycock a daughter who intermarried with Felix Aycock and live in Lafayette, Arkansas,

I have testified, the property, mentioned in the proceedings contains about 104 acres of land more or less, and lies in the vicinity of Sugar loaf Mountain,

This Farm is not susceptible of partition among the parties entitled thereto, without loss and injury, I believe it would be for the benefit of, and interest and advantage, of all the parties concerned, especially of the infant defendant, Hamilton Linthicum, that the property be sold under a decree of the Court, and the proceeds divided among the parties entitled under the direction and supervision of the Court, I should think that this property ought to bring between \$40,00, and \$50,00 an Acre,

Burwell H. Linthicum, a witness of Lawful age produced on the part of the Plaintiffs being first duly sworn and Examined Viva Voce, deposes and says as follows; -

My Name is Burwell H. Linthicum I am a witness of lawful age; my home is in Frederick County, Maryland, although I am at present located in the City of Washington, I knew nearly all of the parties to this cause, and am myself one of the Plaintiffs,

I have just heard Mrs. Watkins who is my aunt, testify and she has correctly named the children, and heirs at law, of John H. S. Linthicum, who was my grandfather,

I know the parties and the property on which he lived. during his lifetime, I look at Exhibits A and B, which are certified Copies of deeds, by which he acquired, the property I look at Exhibit C, which is a certified copy of the deed, by which my Grandfather, conveyed away part of the property, during his lifetime, I think there remains on the farm in the Neighborhood of 104 acres and it lies within a few miles of Dickerson Station,

John H. S. Linthicum died about the year 1896, as nearly as I can remember and left a will of which Exhibit D, which is shown me, is a certified copy The Hannah Frances Linthicum named therein was my Aunt, and she died a few months ago, I remember I was a Pall bearer at her funeral,

The Property as it stands is not in my Judgment, susceptible of Division among the parties entitled thereto, without loss and injury, and I certainly believe it would be for the benefit and advantage of all the parties concerned, and particularly of the Infant Defendant; Hamilton Linthicum that the property be sold, under the Direction of the Court, and the proceeds derived therefrom divided among the parties entitled thereto, In my Judgment the property should Bring from \$35,00 to \$45,00 and acre, if put up at public sale,
