At the request of Eliza Young the following Deed is received for record and recorded Feby-19-1877,

THIS INDENTURE, of two several parties, made and executed, by and between Burtis Bennett, and Catherine Bennett his wife, Wm, Henry Barton, and Sabina Barton, his wife, Cornelious A, Black, and Amelia Black his wife, Ezra Young, and Sabina Young his wife, William Young, and John Henry Krom and Lydia Krom his wife, Samuel e Dotterer and Mary C, Dotterer, his wife, of the first part, and Eliza Young of the second part, this 1st day of December Eighteen Hundred and seventy six, Whereas, by the last will and testament of the late Henry Young, deceased, late of Frederick County, State of Maryland, certain bequests and devises therein was made to the heirs of the said Henry Young, as by reference thereto will fully appear, and whereas, in said will One Clause, thereof distinctly asserts the intention of the said Testator, that his Children shall share and share alike, but in another clause, asserts that if his daughter Eliza or his son, William Shall die without heirs, their portion of said Estate, is then to be distributed, equally remaining among the children, And Whereas the estate of the said Henry Young, has been settled, and closed, up by the Executor, as by will apportioned, and that in the distribution, of said estate, as made by the Orphans Court, of Frederick County, in accordance, with the provisions, and Construction of said Will, did in pursuance thereof award, to Eliza Young, and William Young, the homestead farm, upon which they reside, which property, they now possess, as joint owners, and whereas, the said William Young, is incompetent to attend to his own business,
