FIFTH;- That the said Charles E, Shope, and Lyndhurst T, Shope, Horace A, S Shope, and Maria B, Shope, at the time of their death, were each seized and possessed of an undivided One Sixth interest, in said real Estate, and Edwin I Shope has now been appointed as the administrator of the personal estate of each of these persons, and in that capacity, he the said Edwin I Shope, is made a party Defendant, in these proceeding,

SIXTH;- That the said Alice F, Shope, under the terms of the deed, executed and marked Exhibit No,2, still has the right to occupy and enjoy said real estate, as and for her home, who is unwilling to longer continue in possession of the same, feeling unable to maintain and provide for the said home, and she is satisfied that the property be sold, and joins in the Bill of Complaint, as a party Plaintiff, for that purpose, relinquishing and surrendering her life interest, but reserving and retaining her share of the proceeds arising from the sale of said real estate, in so far as her undivided one-sixth interest and her of the interest of the deceased brother and sisters are concerned,

SEVENTH; That the said real Estate aforesaid known and designated as no,319 east Patrick Street, Frederick City, Maryland, is not susceptible or capable of division or partition, among the parties, entitled, without great loss and injury and it would be to the best interest and advantage of all concerned that said real estate be sold, under a decree of your Honorable Court,

EIGHTH;- That the Defendants, Alice T. Gregory (formerly Alice T, Shope) is a resident of the State of California, and the said Agnes Wheeler, and G, W. Wheeler her husband, are residents of the State of California, and the said Kate Conrad, and O, W, Conrad, her husband, are residents of the State of Ohio, and the said Edwin I, Shope administrator etc., is temporarily residing in Frederick Maryland,

WHEREFORE; The Complainants; pray for the following relief,

1- That the said real estate, known and designated a No, 319, East Patrick Street Frederick City, Maryland, and mentioned in the Bill of Complaint may be sold, under a decree of your Honorable Court, by a trustee appointed for that purpose, and the proceeds arising from said sale be distributed among the parties entitled therein according to their respective rights and interests,

2- That; that they may have all and such further relief as the nature of their case may require,

And your Complainants pray for the following Process, that an Order of Publication may be passed in the usual form against the Non-resident defendants, and the Writ of Subpoena issued to the Sheriff of Frederick County, commanding him to summon Edwin I Shope, Administrator, etc.,

Deed,

At the request of Louisa & Geo, B, Shope, the following deed is recorded 15th day of March 1843,

THIS INDENTURE made this fourteenth, day of March in the Year, of our Lord, eighteen hundred and forty three, between Jacob M, Buckey, of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland, of the one part, and William Eader in Trust for the sole and separate use, benefit and behoof of Louisa Shope, wife of George Shope, of the same County, and State aforesaid, of the other part, Witnesseth, that for & in consideration of the sum of Five Hundred and forty dollars, current money by the said William Eader in Trust for the sole and separate use and benefit and behoof of the said Louisa Shope, to the said Jacob M, Buckey in hand paid, at and before the ensembling and delivery of these presents, the receipt of which he doth, hereby acknowledge, and himself to be herewith fully satisfied, contented and paid, the said Jacob M, Buckey hath granted bargained and sold, aliened
