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The above cause standing ready for a hearing and being submitted, the Bill, Answer, Exhibits, And all other proceedings were by the Court read and considered, and it appearing to the court, that all of the parties are adults, and all of the defendants having filed answers, admitting the allegations of the Bill and consenting to the sale of the real estate,

It is thereupon, this 20th day of July, in the year Nineteen hundred and seventeen, by the Circuit Court, for frederick County, as a Court of equity, and by the authority, of said court, adjudged, Ordered and Decreed, that the land and premises mentioned in these proceedings be sold, and that Edwin I, Shope, of Frederick County, be and he is hereby appointed Trustee to the said sales, and that the course and manner of his proceeding shall be as follows; He shall first file in the Clerks Office a Bond to the State of Maryland, executed by him with a surety or Sureties, to be approved by the Court, or the Clerk thereof, in the penalty of Five thousand Dollars, conditioned for the faithful performance of the Trust, reposed in him by this decree or that may be reposed in him by any future order or decree in the premises, he shall then proceed to make sale of the real estate, having first given at least three weeks previous notice inserted in some newspaper, printed in Frederick County, and such other notice as he may think proper, as he may think proper of the time, place, manner, and terms of sale; which terms of sale Shall be as follows, one-half of the purchase money to be paid in cash on the day of sale, or on the ratification thereof by the Court, the residue in six months the purchaser, or purchasers giving his her or their notes with approved security, and bearing interest from the day of sale or all cash at the option of the purchaser, and as soon as convenient after any such sale or sales, the said Trustee shall return to this Court, a full and particular account of the same
