The Bill Of Complaint of Charles A, Carlisle, Himon N, Werntz, and J, Eugene Meadows, who sue as well for themselves as for all othe creditors, of Winnie Forrest, who will come in and Contribute, to the Expenses of this Suit, respectfully, represents;-

1; That a certain Winnie Forrest, late of Frederick county, Maryland, Deceased, departed this life, intestate, on or about the \_\_\_\_\_ day of April, 1918, and left as her heirs at law the Following, a Surviving husband, the said George W, Forrest, and the following Children, Viz Harry M, Forrest, and adult whose wife's name is Mary M, Forrest, an adult, and wilbur E, Forrest Elmer Forrest, Garland Forrest, Arlington Forrest, Carroll Forest, Margaret Forrest, Evelyn Forrest. and Dorothy Forrest, all infants residing at Brunswick, in said Frederick County, Maryland,

2; That said Winnie Forrest at the time of her death, owned no personal estate, that no letters of Administration have been granted on her estate, and the persons entitled to such letters, have declared that no Application will be made as there is no estate, to administer,

3; That said Winnie Forrest was at the time of her death, seized and possessed of a lot of land, in Brunswick, Frederick County, Maryland, Known and designated as lot No, 8, in Block No, 2, as shown on plat of W, W, Weners Second addition, to Brunswick as said plat is recorded in Liber W, I, P, No, 13, folio 3, one of the Land Records of said frederick County,
