I am one of the Defendants in this suit, and the surviving husband of the late Winena Forrest, also Known as Winnie Forrest, who did in March 1918, intestate, and left surviving, her husband, and the following Children, Harry M, Forrest aged about 23, years, whose wife's name is is marry M, Forrest, and adult, Wilbur R, Forrest now aged about 21 years, who was not of age at the time of filing this suit, Elmer Forrest, aged about 20 years, Garland Forrest, aged 18 years, Arlington Forrest aged 16 years, Carrel Forrest, age 12 years, Margaret Forrest, aged about 8 years Everly Forrest, aged 6 years, and Dorothy Forrest, aged 4 years, all residents of Frederick County, Maryland, excepting Wilbur and Elmer, have recently gone west
