By request of James A. C. Bond, Esq., I have surveyed all the lands of Henry Bussard Deceased, lying partly in Frederick County, and partly in Carroll County, including part of the tract called "Parrs' Range" part of the tract ^{called} "Favor & Ease," conveyed to said Bussard, from Francis Brengle, Admr. of Peter Brengle, Sr. late Sheriff of Frederick County, by deed dated the 8th, day of June A. D. 1840, also part of the tract called, "The Resurvey on Long Trused" conveyed to said Bussard, from Francis A. Switzer, and wife, by deed dated the 8th day of Jan, 1861, A. D. 1859 and part of the tract called "Hammonds Continuance", conveyed, to the said Bussard, from S. Prately James by deed dated the 17th day of February A. D. 1841,
