TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT;--

Your Orator, Complaining, says;--

1. That a certain James Graham, late of Frederick County, departed this life intestate on or about the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ A. D. 1898, being seized and possessor of certain real estate, situated in Buckeystown Election District No. 1, Frederick County, as follows;--

(a) By a deed from Ignatius D. Richardson and wife, dated May 19, 1866, unto the said James Graham, duly recorded in Liber J. W. L. C. No. 4, fol. 88, one of the Land Records for Frederick County, containing 3 acres of land, more or less.

(b) By a deed from Ignatius D. Richardson and wife, dated March 16, 1874, unto the said James Graham, duly recorded in Liber T. G. 2, fol. 681, one of the Land Records for Frederick County, containing 1 rood, 9-1/4 perches of land.
