To the Honorable, the Judges of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity. The Petition of Milton G. Urner and Emory L. Coblentz, Trustees of John J. Staup, respectfully represents unto your Honors; -

1st. That on the 19th day of January, in the year 1909, a certain John J. Staup, of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland, executed unto your Petitioners a deed of trust for the benefit of his creditors, and conveyed unto your Petitioners all of his property, real and personal, upon the trust set forth in said deed, all of which will fully appear by reference to said deed of trust, a certified copy of which is herewith filed and marked exhibit No. 1, which it is prayed may be taken and considered as a part of this Petition.

2nd. That your Petitioners have accepted said trust and have filed their duly approved bond on the Office of the Clerk of your Honorable Court in the penalty of Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8000.00) conditioned upon the faithful discharge of the trusts reposed in them.

3rd. That your Petitioners desire your Honorable Court to take cognizance of said trust and to direct your Trustees in the administration of the same.

4th. That the trust estate consists principally of a farm and a mountain lot containing One Hundred Acres of land, more or less, which was conveyed unto the said John J.
