

Manor and all my other lands in Allegheney and Washington Counties to my surviving sisters at the death of all my sisters and of my two Nephews without leaving legitimate children I leave all the said East Wellesley Manor to my cousin William Woodville All my portion of the lands from William Carroll at public sale by my mother I leave to me sisters during their lives with power to cut off the timber and lease minerals &c, after the death of all my sisters I leave the said lands to my Nephew Alexander Simon McTavish and his legitimate issue except that portion laid off for the mineral Spring which I leave equally between my two Nephews after the death of all my sisters and to their lawful issue All my lands in Baltimore County and the adjoining Counties of Maryland I leave equally between my three sisters in fee and I recommend them to make the division themselves The residue of my property of every description of which I am possessed or to which I am entitled I leave to my three sisters in fee one third to each sister I appoint General George Stewart and his brother Doctor Richard Stewart and my Nephew Charles Carroll McTavish Executors of this my Last Will and Testament for all matters and things situate in America and I constitute and appoint my sister Lady Stafford my executrix of this my last Will and Testament for all persons contained in this Will that are situated in England also of all stocks and lands and property of every description with Messrs Hoare and the London Joint Stock Bank or else where in England

In Testimony Whereof I the said Marchioness Wellesley have subscribed my name and affixed my seal to this my last Will and Testament executed in Duplicate the one intended for England the other for the United States on this Twenty fourth day of September in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty two.
