William Warner Holmes late of No. 20 Harley Street Cavendish Square in the County of Middlesex but now of No. 5 Ludgate Hill in the City of London, Francis Baker of Hampton Court in the said County of Middlesex Sergeant- Wyatt Gibbs Clerk to Charles Edward Jennett of Kingston upon Thames in the County of Surrey Solicitor and John Bushell also Clerk to the said Charles Edward Jennett severally made Oath and say as follows;

And first the said William Warner Holmes for himself saith that he this Deponent hath this day carefully looked upon and inspected the original Will of the Most Honorable Mary Anne Dowager Marchioness Wellesley (now deceased) hereunto to annexed beginning with the words "This is the last Will and Testament of me Mary Annie Marchioness Wellesley" and ending with the words, "the other for the United States on this twenty fourth day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty two" That he this Deponent was present on the said Twenty fourth day of September together with David Hoffman and Henry Wright the two other subscribed Witnesses to the said Will and did see and hear the said Mary Anne Marchioness Wellesley sign seal publish and declare the said Will as and for her last Will and Testament and thereupon this Deponent and the said David Hoffman and Henry Wright at the request of the said Testatrix in her presence and the presence of each other subscribed their names to the Attestation at the foot of the said Will as Witnesses thereto that to the best of this Deponents knowledge judgment and belief the said Testatrix was at the time she so executed the said Will fully competent to execute the same And the said Deponent Francis Baker, Wyatt Gibbs and John Bushell for themselves severally say that they these Deponents have this day carefully looked and inspected the Codicil hereunto annexed marked B. beginning with the words "This is a Codicil to the last Will and Testament of me Mary Anne Marchioness Wellesley" and ending with the words "In witness and in proof whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this seventh day of December One Thousand eight hundred and fifty three". That they these Deponents were to gether present on the said seventh day of December and did see and hear the said Marchioness Wellesley sign seal publish and declare the said Codicil as and for a Codicil to her last Will and Testament and thereupon these Deponents at the request of the said Marchioness and in her presence and in the presence of each other subscribed the Attestation at the foot of the said Codicil as witnesses thereto And that to the best of their knowledge judgment and belief the said Mary Anne Marchioness Wellesley was at the time she so executed the said Codicil fully competent to execute the same.
