

Railroad; and with it north $49\frac{1}{2}$ degrees east, $12\frac{6}{10}$ perches; north one degree east, $6\frac{36}{100}$ perches; west $14\frac{8}{10}$ perches; north $15\frac{1}{2}$ degrees east $77\frac{72}{100}$ perches; north $57\frac{1}{2}$ degrees west, $74\frac{6}{10}$ perches to intersect the east margin of the church lot, and with it south 4 degrees west, $10\frac{1}{2}$ perches; to the place of beginning, containing about 540 acres".

"Tenement No. 2, now in the occupancy of H. Smith, part of the lot No. 9, one of the grand divisions of 'Carroll's Manor', as follows;

Beginning for the outline at a stone planted on the west side of the County road leading to the point of Rocks, and running thence as now surveyed, June 1890, south $39\frac{1}{4}$ degrees west, $36\frac{1}{2}$ perches, to a stone then in the center of the point of Rocks Road; south $38\frac{3}{4}$ degrees west, 54 perches; south; 13 degrees east, $75\frac{8}{10}$ perches; south $8\frac{1}{2}$ degrees west, 94 perches to a large stone in the cross roads, then with the road leading to Adamstown, south 54 degrees east, 62 perches, to Tenement No. 1, and with it reversed, north $82\frac{1}{2}$ degrees east, 139 perches; north $60\frac{1}{2}$ degrees east, $60\frac{24}{100}$ perches, to a gate-post; north 20 degrees east, 55 perches; north $7\frac{1}{2}$ degrees east, 148 perches to the center of the County road leading to Buckeystown, and with it north $83\frac{3}{4}$ degrees west, 231 perches, to the place of beginning, containing about 389 acres, 1 road and 25 square perches." "Courses and distances of the woodland, part of lot No. 9, one of the grand divisions of 'Carroll's Manor', as follows;

Beginning at a large stone planted on the south side of the Buckeystown Road leading to the point of Rocks Road with a hole in the center of it, and running thence as now surveyed June 1890; north $83\frac{3}{4}$ degrees west, 122 perches, to the northeast corner of the Church Lot, and with it south 4 degrees west, 25 perches to the end of the last line but one of Tenement No. 1, and with the lines thereof reversed south $57\frac{1}{2}$ degrees west, $77\frac{72}{100}$ perches; east $14\frac{8}{10}$ perches; south 1 degree west, $6\frac{36}{100}$ perches; south $49\frac{1}{2}$ degrees west, $12\frac{6}{10}$ perches; south $65\frac{1}{4}$ degrees east, $31\frac{60}{100}$ perches; south $17\frac{1}{4}$ degrees west, 128 perches to the outline of Division No. 9, and with the lines thereof connecting the same south 86 degrees east, 93 perches; north $6\frac{1}{2}$ degrees east, 290 perches to a large stone in the Buckeystown Road; thence south $82\frac{1}{2}$ degrees west, $40\frac{3}{10}$ perches, to the place of beginning, containing about 175 acres and 36 square perches." "Course and distance of a small piece of land said to belong to Tenement No. 2, lying on the west side of the Point of Rocks Road, and adjoining Franklin Thomas as follows;

Beginning for the same at the end of the sixth line expressed in a deed from George Thomas to Franklin Thomas dated July 26, 1878, and with the lines of said deed south 5 perches; south 61 degrees west, $15\frac{1}{2}$ perches to the public road leading to Jefferson; north $85\frac{1}{2}$ degrees west, 16 perches; north $66\frac{1}{4}$ degrees west, 8 perches intersecting the twelfth line of a tract of land called 'Boston', surveyed for George Thomas of H, on the _____ day 1835; and with said line reversed south 16 degrees east 29 perches; then by a straight line to the end of the first line of this survey, containing about $2\frac{1}{2}$ acres."

And a part of the tract of land called "Fielderea", as described in the survey of the grand division of "Carrollton Manor", made by James Durben, surveyor, December 24, 1833, as follows; "And to which lot No. 9 there is attached all the remaining part of lot No. 24, being part of a tract of land called 'Fielderea', which was conveyed on or about the 28th day of June (decr. per Mants) 1792 by James Hunter's Executors to Charles Carroll, Esq., for 212 acres.

Beginning for the said remaining part of said lot No. 24 at a stone planted at the end the 9 line of said lot, it being also the end of the 9th line of the part of this lot which was conveyed by Charles Carroll, Esq, to Joseph Smith, Senr. on or about the
