

The Petition and Complaint of John W. Humm and Carrie A. Humm his wife the Complainants in the above entitled cause respectfully represents unto your Honorable Court.

1. That since the filing of the Bill of Complaint in the above entitled cause, after summons had been had, but before the cause being at issue, one, Rachael D. Keyser, one of the Defendants in the foregoing cause departed this life, intestate, leaving as her only heirs at law and next of kin the following children, viz, Alice K. Bruce a daughter whose husbands name is Duncan Bruce who are non residents of the State of Maryland, and reside in the State of Florida, and a son L. Frank Keyser, whose wife's name is \_\_\_\_\_ Keyser, who are non residents of the State of Maryland and reside in the State of Pennsylvania.

2. That all the right, title, interest and estate of the said Rachael D. Keyser, by virtue of her decease, in and to the property mentioned in Exhibits No. 1 and 2 to the Bill of Complaint filed in the above cause, has vested in the heirs at law of said Rachael D. Keyser as above set forth.

3. That said heirs at law should be made parties defendant to the foregoing cause to the end that they may be required to answer the premises as provided by law, and a Decree be passed by your Honorable Court, directing a sale as is prayed in the original Bill of Complaint.

Your Petitioners therefore pray.

(a) That your Honorable Court will pass an order making the said Alice K. Bruce and husband and the said L. Frank Keyser and wife parties defendant in the foregoing cause.

(b) That an order of Publication be granted against said Alice K. Bruce and husband and Frank Keyser and wife who are non-residents of the State of Maryland and who live in the State of Connecticut and Pennsylvania respectively, warning them to be and appear in your Honorable Court on some day certain to be named therein, in person or by solicitor, to answer the premises and to show cause if any they have why a Decree should not be passed against them as prayed in the Original Bill of Complaint.

(c) And for such other and further relief to which your petitioners may be entitled in the premises. As in duty &c,

Frank Keyser and \_\_\_\_\_ Keyser his wife, who appear to be non residents of the State of Maryland, warning them and each of them to be and appear in this Court on some certain day to be named therein, either in person or by solicitor, to answer the premises and to show cause if any they have why a Decree should not be passed as prayed in said Bill of Complaint.
