26 x.Int. The wheat raised this year has been threshed has it not?

27 x Int. How many acres does that represent?

Ans. About 51 Acres, I suppose.

28 x Int. How much do you sow to the Acre?

Ans. I aim to sow two bushels to the acre and and did so last year.

29 x Int. How much fertilizer did you sow on that 51 acres?

Ans. About 3½ tons; my share of it costs 27.50 but I paid for it all.

30 x Int. How much wheat are you goint to sow this fall?

Ans. About the same 52-3 or 4 Acres.

31 x.Int. You expect to sow about the same amount of seed wheat and fertilizer?

Ans. About the same quantity; but the fertilizer is higher this year, I paid over 14 dollars per ton for it, S.C. Rock.

32 x.Int. As I understand you, you can't give the Court any idea of what you paid your mother as income for the farm since your father's death?

Ans. No sir; She ought to know as well as I. Gen.Int by the Examiners.
