(c) All that tract of land containing 3 acres 1 rood and 34 square perches of land, more or less, situate, lying and being in Mount Pleasant District, in Frederick County, Maryland, and being all the same property described in a deed from John C. Kefauver and wife unto the said Daniel E. Stone dated August 29, A.D. 1895, and recorded in Liber J.L.J. No. 11, Folio 279, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, as by reference thereto will more fully and at large appear, a certified copy of which deed is filed herewith marked Exhibit C. (d) All that tract of land containing 4 acres, 2 roods and 19 square perches of land, more or less, situated in Mount Pleasant District, in Frederick County, Maryland, it being all the same property which was conveyed unto the said Daniel E. Stone by David Main, et al. heir at law of Ann E. Stone by deed dated January 11, A.D. 1888, and recorded in Liber A.P. No. 2, Folio 605, one of the land records of Frederick County, as by reference thereto will more fully at large appear, a certified copy of which deed is filed herewith marked Exhibit D.

All of which certified copies of deeds, it is prayed may be taken and considered as a part hereof as fully and to the same extent as if incorporated herein.

2. That being seized and possessed as aforesaid, the said Daniel E. Stoner departed this life on or about the 5th day of April, A.D. 1924, leaving surviving him the following widow and children and heirs at law, to-wit; - Ida E. Stone, widow, Caroline S. Holland, a daughter, whose husband's name is George A. Holland, Lenore S. Boyle, a daughter, whose husband's name is J. Brooke Boyle; Halbert L. Stone, a son, whose wife's name is Julia Stone; Elizabeth D. Stone, widow of Daniel E. Stone, Jr., who is now deceased; and Jesse Edwin Stone and William Owings Stone, infant children of the said Daniel E. Stone, Jr., all of whom are residents of Frederick County.

3. That the property herein mentioned and described is not susceptible of division among the parties entitled thereto without loss and injury, and that it would be to the great benefit and advantage of all the parties concerned, and especially the infant defendants, that the said property be sold forthwith and the proceeds distributed among the parties thereunto entitled under the direction and supervision of your honorable court.

TO THE END, THEREFORE, -

1. That the property mentioned in this Bill of Complaint may be sold by a Trustee to be appointed by your honorable court and the proceeds thereof distributed among the parties thereunto entitled under the direction and supervision of your honorable court and for such other and further relief as the nature and equity of their case may require. May it please your Honors to grant unto your complainants the Writ of Subpoena in the usual form against the said Jesse Edwin Stone and William Owings Stone, infants, who live in Emmitsburg, Frederick County, Maryland, commanding them and each of them to be and appear in your Honorable Court either in person or by solicitor on some day certain to be named therein, to answer the premises and abide by and perform such of the decrees as may be passed herein.
