

3. That from the nature of the business conducted by said Frederick City Packing Company, and especially during "Packing Season", it is necessary for said Corporation to use and expend large sums of money for the payment of labor, cost of corn, cans boxes and other expenses and items essential for the proper operation of a large Canning Industry.
4. That in order to provide sufficient money to meet the immediate expenses, pending a sale of the manufactured products, it has been the custom of the Directors of the said Frederick City Packing Company to borrow the money so needed during its "Packing Season" and to repay the same out of the monies received from the sale of its goods when packed.
5. That in the ordinary course of business pursued in said respect as aforesaid, certain sums of money have been borrowed by said Corporation upon the faith of its property and the 1/3 undivided interest as conveyed to your Petitioner in trust, and that the said Charles W. Hahn and wife heretofore bound their interests in said real property by incumbrances thereon, and have endorsed the notes of the said Corporation.
6. That the "Packing Season" is just about commencing and your Petitioner avers that it will be necessary to borrow certain sums of money in order to pay the immediate expenses of operation by said Corporation, pending a sale of the manufactured product.
7. That in order to successfully conduct the business of the said Corporation and to protect and further the interests therein of the Trust estate created by said Deed, your Petitioner avers that it will be necessary to borrow money, and as the trust estate is entitled to participate in the profits of the Corporation and equally liable for prospective losses to be incurred therein, it is fit and proper that the trust estate should be made to bear its proportion of the burdens necessary for the operation of the business, and said estate should be bound for its proportion of the money so borrowed.
8. That under and by virtue of the terms of the said Deed of Trust, your Petitioner as such Trustee was given full and complete power, in his discretion and upon obtaining the consent of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, in Equity, to borrow money for the operation of the farms, and to bind the trust estate in his hands for the money so borrowed.
9. Wherefore your Petitioner prays your Honors to assume jurisdiction of the settlement of the Trust estate, so that he may execute his said trust under the direction and protection of your Honorable Court;—

And that your Honorable Court may pass an order authorizing and empowering him as such Trustee to borrow money for the operation of the business of the Frederick City Packing Company, in so far as the trust estate is interested therein, and to bind the trust estate for such money so borrowed.

Ordered by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, this 12th day of August, A.D. 1902, the foregoing Petition having been read and considered, that the Court hereby assume jurisdiction of the trusts created by the Deed referred to in said Petition; and that Henry A. Hahn, Trustee herein, is hereby authorized and empowered as such Trustee to borrow money for the purposes of the operation of the business of the Frederick City Packing Company, in proportion to the interests of the trust estate therein, and to bind the estate for the payment of the sums so borrowed on its interest in said business, but in no event to exceed in amount one-third of the sum which it may be necessary to borrow for said purposes. And it is further ordered that he make report of the sums so borrowed at least every six months.
