

That your Petitioner desires to retire from and resign such trust, and he filed herewith as part hereof, marked Exhibit "R" a full and particular account under oath of his receipts and disbursements as such trustee since the date of his last report viz: September 17th, 1894.

That the total amount of income received by him as said Trustee since his last report from the investments held by him in trust on this account up to and until May 29 1896, the date of filing this petition and report amounts to the sum of \$2,326.50 and he, as said Trustee prays an allowance for money paid out and expended by him for and on account of said trust estate as follows .....

as will appear from said account marked Exhibit "R" together with the Vouchers for such payment herewith exhibited and filed-

That said sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars held by him as Trustee as aforesaid is invested in the securities taken at the appraisement, November 19th 1890, in accordance with the provisions of said Will of Ann P. Marshall deceased, and owing to changes of investments heretofore approved by said Circuit Court for Frederick County Sitting as a Court of Equity, in certain other securities, as appears from Exhibit "B" herewith filed, That over three fourths of said sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars invested as shown in said Exhibit "B" consists of Irredeemable and redeemable ground rents in Baltimore City. That your Petitioner is informed and believes that it will be satisfactory to Mary Gooche Johnson, the widow of Richard P. Johnson, the surviving cestui que trust, and to Edward S. Johnson, Mary Eleanor Johnson and Blain Johnson, the residuary legatees of said trust estate under said Will of Ann P. Marshall deceased, for the Mercantile trust and Deposit Company of Baltimore, a Corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of Maryland, and authorized to act as Trustee, &c, to be appointed as trustee in place of said petitioner Your Petitioner therefore prays.

(1) That said Court cause such notice to be given by publication in such paper or papers, and for such time as to it may seem proper, and that your Petitioner may be released and discharged as Trustee as aforesaid, from the further execution of said trust upon the conveyance and transfer by him of said securities and investments of said trust estate to his successors as Trustee when duly qualified and approved, and that said successor as trustee execute a Release and discharge to said George Johnson Trustee for said trust estate.

(2) That said Report and Account by said George Johnson Trustee with his cestui que trust, Mary Gooche Johnson may be settled in your Honorable Court, and that said cause be referred to the Auditor to State an account, and that said George Johnson Trustee be allowed counsel fees, commissions, taxed costs of suit, and expenses incurred in the execution of said trust up to his discharge as said Trustee according to the provisions of said Will of Ann P. Marshall deceased, and that said George Johnson Trustee be allowed by the Auditor the sum of \$27.05 overpaid by him in making change of investment as ordered by said Circuit Court for Frederick County, In Equity, by Decree dated October 10, 1894.

(3) That your Petitioner may have such other and further relief as his case may require. And your Petitioner will ever pray, &c.
