Bradshaw, of Frederick, Maryland, married to Lula E. Bradshaw a daughter, Clara Belle B. Bergeron, who resides in Baltimore City, Maryland, married to Benjamin F. Bergeron, a daughter, Beulah Benton Hennessey, who resides in Los Angeles, California, married to John H. Hennessey, a grand son, Austin Lewis Bradshaw, who resides in Baltimore City, Maryland, married to Ida Isabel R. Bradshaw, a grand son, Earle Schley Bradshaw, resident of Baltimore City, Maryland, and who is married to Marie S. Bradshaw, the said Austin Lewis Bradshaw and Earle Schley Bradshaw, being the only heirs at law of George William Bradshaw, a deceased son of said Annie May Bradshaw, a grand son, Eston Owings Mercier, resident of Catonsville, Baltimore, Maryland, married to Ruth C. Mercier, a grand daughter, Anna Alvene M. Reynolds, resident of Baltimore City, Maryland, married to Edward J. Reynolds, the said Eston Owings Mercier and Anna Alvene M. Reynolds being the only children and heirs at law of May Bradshaw Mercier, who died intestate some years ago as the wife of Sidney Mercier;- and the following children and only heirs at law of George W. Hauer, who died October 25th, 1891, intestate at Washington, D.C., the said George W. Hauer having been a brother of the said Charles Adam Hauer, namely, a daughter, Alice May Hamburg, now residing in Washington, D.C., married to John Hamburg, a daughter, Annie Oliver Hauer, a widow, now resident of Washington, D.C., and a son, John Adam Hauer, unmarried, also resident of Washington, D.C.

All of the persons above named are over twenty-one years of age, excepting Frank Robert Chase, Junior, and who was about 19 years of age in February, 1925.

There is no tenant in said dwelling house at this time and it is not susceptible of partition or division among the next of kin or heirs at law of said Charles Adam Hauer deceased, without loss or injury to the parties interested and I think it will be to the interest of all parties interested that the same be at once sold and the net proceeds divided among the parties entitled thereto.

John Loats Bradshaw, a witness of lawful age, produced on the part of the Defendants, having been first duly sworn and examined in his own behalf, deposes and says:-

My name is John Loats Bradshaw, I am 52 years of age and I am resident of Frederick City, in Frederick County, Maryland, and I am one of the Defendants in this case. I am a son of Annie May Bradshaw, now deceased, intestate, and she was the wife of William Bradshaw, now deceased, and my mother was a sister of Charles Adam Hauer, deceased, and I am one of his nephews and I have read the testimony of Isabella Sophia Webster given in this case and believe the same to be true. And I am now married, and my wife's name is Lula E. Bradshaw. My brother, George William Bradshaw died in Baltimore about 1918 or 1919, and he was married twice and by his first wife he told me he had a son whom he left in Chicago as an infant about thirty-six years ago, and about a month ago a young man who said he was Charles William Bradshaw, the son above referred to of my Brother, George William Bradshaw, by his first wife, visited in Frederick, Maryland, and stated he was said Charles William Bradshaw, about 36 years of age, son of my said Brother, and from my conversation with him, I believe his statement as to his relationship as the son
