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ORDER OF PUBLICATION.

The object of this Bill of Complaint is to obtain a decree for the sale of the real estate and premises of which Isaac E. Strine died seized and possessed, and which descended unto the above-named children, as heirs at law and next of kin of the said Isaac E. Strine, and unto Susan E. Strine, widow of said Isaac E. Strine.

The bill states the said Isaac E. Strine, at the time of his death, on or about the 10th day of November, A. D. 1919, intestate, was seized and possessed of the land and premises specified in the deed from Jacob Delaplaine and wife, dated October 16, 1880, and duly recorded in Liber A. F. No. 2, folio 443 & co., one of the Land records of Frederick county, containing One Acre of land more or less, and of the land and premises specified in the deed from Sophia V. Rout and husband, dated September 14, 1891, and duly recorded in Liber J. L. J. No. 1, folio 264, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, containing seven acres of land, more or less, and that said land and premises descended unto his widow, Susan E. Strine, and Susan E. Strine, having died in February, 1925, her interest descended unto the aforesaid children as her heirs at law and next of kin.

The bill further states that the said real estate consists of two tracts of land, improved by a two-story dwelling house and outbuildings, and in its present state, cannot be divided equally among the parties in interest without loss and injury, and partition cannot be made without the aid of this Court and that it would be to the interest of all the parties concerned to sell the said real estate under the direction of this Court.

It is thereupon, this 7th day of July, A. D. 1925, ordered by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, and by the authority thereof, that the said Complainants, by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper, published in Frederick County, once in each of four successive weeks prior to the 6th day of August, A. D. 1925, give notice to the said Gladys C. Strine-Anderson, absent defendant, of the object and substance of this bill, warning her to be and appear in this Court in person or by solicitor, on or before the 22nd day of August, A. D. 1925, to show cause, if any she has, why a decree ought not to be passed as prayed.
