TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT;-

The petition of John McAbee filed on behalf of himself and all other creditors who may contribute to the expenses of these proceedings respectfully shows unto your Honors;

FIRST; As will appear more fully from the record of the proceedings had in the above entitled cause, and with the papers filed therein, this proceeding was instituted by Mrs. Luville M. Leesnitzer and George M. Leesnitzer, and Annie M. Cragg and John H. Cragg, for the purpose of selling the real estate of which a certain Roy Edmonston, late of Frederick County, died seized and possessed, and for a distribution of the proceeds of such sale as the parties were entitled thereto according to their respective interests.

SECOND; That on the 30th day of January, 1928, your Honorable Court appointed Frank L. Stoner George R. Dennis, Jr., and Edgar H. McBride, Esquires, trustees to make sale of said real estate, who having duly qualified, are to sell the said real estate in front of the Court House door in Frederick City, Maryland, on Thursday, February 23, 1928, at the hour of 11 o'clock a.m.

THIRD; That the value of the personal property in the said estate is insufficient to pay the debts owing by the decedent to his various creditors, including your petitioner.

FOURTH; That the said Roy Edmonston, deceased, was indebted unto your petitioner in the sum of Four Hundred and Fifty-Six (\$456) Dollars, being the amount due your petitioner for services including cooking, washing, ironing, painting, keeping house, digging pond, making side-walks, laying concrete, tending to chickens, building cellar wall and house-work in general, for a period of time beginning on the 15th day of June, 1925, and terminating on the 3d day of September, 1927, the said services being requested by the said Roy Edmonston of your petitioner, and rendered at his request in consideration of various promises from time to time that he would fully compensate your petitioner for such services rendered, and your petitioner filed herewith his bill setting out the services rendered and the charges for the same, which is filed herewith and marked "Exhibit Bill", which is prayed may be taken as a part of this proceeding as also any other "Exhibits" filed with this petition.
