ORDER OF PUBLICATION.

George Uglow, widower, John F. Pote and Lizzie Pote, his wife, Ruth Buzzard and Jesse R. Buzzard, her husband, Louise Showers and Philip Showers, her husband, Ethel Jones and Curtis Jones, her husband, Gladys Grimes and George Grimes, her husband, Edmond Uglow (unmarried), Austin Uglow, (unmarried), Infant.

The object of this proceeding is to procure a decree for the sale of the real estate of the said Barbara C. Hershel, deceased, situated, lying and being in Hauvers District, Frederick County, Maryland. The Bill states, in substance, that the said Barbara C. Hershel, late of Frederick County, Maryland, deceased, was in her lifetime seized and possessed in fee simple of certain tracts or parcels of land, situated, lying and being in Hauvers District, Frederick County, Maryland, to-wit;

(1) All that tract or parcel of land that was conveyed to the said Barbara C. Hershel by deed from Gideon Buzzards and wife, said deed bearing date April 6, 1878, and recorded in Liber T.G. No. 2, Folio 264, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, Maryland, and containing 12 acres, 2 roods and 7 square perches of land, more or less, (2) all that tract or parcel of land that was conveyed to the said Barbara C. Hershel from David A. Hershel, bearing date the 6th day of April 1892, and which deed is duly recorded among the Land Records of Frederick County, Maryland, said tract containing $3\frac{1}{2}$ acres of land, more or less; that said Barbara C. Hershel died on or about the _____ day of June, 1907, seized and possessed of said lands and left surviving her the following children and descendants as her only heirs at law, to-wit; - a daughter, Hattie M. Bowman, who intermarried with Herbert C. Bowman, the Plaintiffs, both of whom are adults and reside in Washington County, Maryland; a son, John F. Pote, whose wife's name is Lizzie Pote, both of whom are adults and reside in Turnbull County, Ohio; a daughter, Carrie J. Uglow, whose husband's name is George Uglow, said Carrie J. Uglow having departed this life on or about the _____ day of _____ 1921, leaving surviving her, her husband, George Uglow, whose whereabouts is unknown, and the following children of the said Carrie J. Uglow born of said marriage, to-wit; (1) Ruth Buzzard, a daughter, whose husband's name is Jesse R. Buzzard, both of whom are adults and reside in Jefferson County, West Virginia, (2) Louise Showers, a daughter of the said Carrie Uglow, whose husband's name is Philip Showers, both of whom are adults and reside in Berkeley County, West Virginia; (3) Ethel Jones, a daughter of the said Carrie Uglow, whose husband's name is Curtis Jones, both of whom are adults and reside in Jefferson County, West Virginia; (4) Gladys Grimes, a daughter of the said Carrie Uglow, whose husband's name is George Grimes, both of whom are adults and reside in Jefferson County, West Virginia; (5) Edmond Uglow, a son of the said Carrie Uglow, who is an adult and unmarried and resides in Jefferson County, West Virginia; (6) Austin Uglow, a son of the said Carrie Uglow, who is an infant, under the age of twenty-one years, unmarried and resides in Loudoun County, Virginia; and George Uglow, whose whereabouts is unknown.

And the Bill of Complaint further alleges that the said real estate is not susceptible of partition or division among the parties entitled to interests therein, without material loss and injury to their respective interests in said real estate, and that it will be necessary and
