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The Petition and report of sale of William M. Kennedy, Attorney or Agent named in a mortgage from John Lewis and Gladys I. Lewis, his wife, to The Real Estate and Improvement Company of Baltimore City, respectfully shows unto your Honors;

1st. That the said John Lewis and Gladys I. Lewis, his wife, being indebted unto The Real Estate and Improvement Company of Baltimore City, a body corporate of the State of Maryland, in the sum of twenty-four hundred dollars (\$2400.00) did on the Eighth day of November, in year Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-six, to secure the payment of the said indebtedness, executed and delivered their deed of mortgage conveying unto the said The Real Estate and Improvement Company of Baltimore City all those pieces or parcels of ground situate, lying and being in or near Brunswick, Frederick County, State of Maryland, and described as follows;
