Q How much land is on the other side of that alley?

A From the alley back down there's a lot and the stable sets on that side.

Q About how much land is it?

A I never stepped it. It is just a small lot there. The lot North of the railroad is a heap larger.

Q What is the width of the main lot that borders on the street, the pike, about how much?

A About 100 feet. I didn't step it.

Q You think about 100 feet? A. Something like that.

Q You know the depth of the lot?

A No indeed I don't.

Q About, in your judgment? From the front back to this alley? The mansion house is on the lot?

A Yes, it is on the front lot.

Q You say it is about 100 feet on the pike, and the depth back you don't know exactly how much? A. No, sir.
