

The Central Trust Company of Maryland, with full authority to sell and convey any or all of my aforesaid property in order that it may be converted into cash, in trust and confidence nevertheless, that they will invest the proceeds from the sale thereof in some safe and reliable investment, paying the income and profits arising therefrom in semi-annual installments unto my beloved wife, Maud C. Humerick."

FOURTH. That The Central Trust Company of Maryland, as Executor named in said last Will and Testament, stated a First Account in the Orphans Court for Frederick County, Maryland, on the date April 15th, in the year 1931, in which First Account the sum of \$2057.50 is named as "Retained for Next Account", and there was distributed to The Central Trust Company of Maryland as Trustee under the terms of said last Will and Testament "Exhibit C. O. H." "Personal property as per inventory \$73.10, real estate \$2050.00, cash \$3151.01".

FIFTH. That the item "real estate \$2050.00", is the appraised value of the dwelling house property of said Testator, Charles O. Humerick, located at Lewistown, in Frederick County, Maryland.

SIXTH. That said The Central Trust Company of Maryland, as Trustee, with powers and for the purposes expressed in said last Will and Testament "Exhibit C. O. H." has held said trust estate, namely, the sum of \$73.10, and \$3151.01 and \$2057.50, and has paid over the income arising therefrom semi-annually unto your Petitioner up until the date about August 1st, in the year 1931.

SEVENTH. That the said The Central Trust Company of Maryland has not applied to your Honorable Court to assume jurisdiction of the trust committed to it under the terms of said last Will and Testament, "Exhibit C. O. H." but has acted as said testamentary Trustee without any authority or direction of your Honorable Court, since the date April 15th, in the year 1931.

EIGHTH. That said The Central Trust Company of Maryland and its assets, and the corpus of the trust estate under the terms of the said last Will and Testament, "Exhibit C. O. H." is now in the hands of George W. Page, Bank Commissioner for the State of Maryland, Receiver for The Central Trust Company of Maryland, and under the jurisdiction of your Honorable Court in No. 12,299 on the Docket of your Honorable Court, and said The Central Trust Company of Maryland, Trustee, now fails and neglects to act in the performance of its duties as said Trustee.

NINTH. That it is necessary a Trustee be appointed by your Honorable Court in place and stead of said The Central Trust Company of Maryland, to the end that said trust estate may be preserved for the benefit of your Petitioner, and those entitled in remainder under the terms of said last Will and Testament, "Exhibit C. O. H." under the jurisdiction and authority of your Honorable Court.

TENTH. That your Petitioner desires to recommend unto your Honors, the appointment of Union Bridge Banking and Trust Company, a body corporate of the State of Maryland, located at Union Bridge, in Carroll County, in the State of Maryland, and duly authorized by its Charter as granted by Chapter 369 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, Session of 1902, to execute trusts, to be the Trustee with the powers and duties named in said "Exhibit C. O. H." for the benefit of your Petitioner and those entitled in remainder to the corpus of said trust estate.

ELEVENTH. That said Union Bridge Banking and Trust Company, a body corporate under the Laws of the State of Maryland, has signified its willingness to accept said trust if appointed to be said Trustee by your Honorable Court, as evidenced by the paper writing signed by said Union Bridge Banking and Trust Company filed herewith as a part hereof, and marked "Exhibit U. B. B. and T. Co.".
