

SECOND: That your Complainant caused to be issued and published an Order of Publication directed against the Defendants, Harry C. Brathwaite, Fleda C. Hudson, Laurence Shorb, Margaret Shorb, his wife, Joseph Stouter, Ina Edna Stouter, infants, all non-residents of the State of Maryland, requiring them to be and appear either in person or by solicitor in your Honorable Court on or before the 4th day of December, 1931, to show cause why the Decree ought not to be passed as prayed, which Order of Publication was duly and regularly published in the Frederick News as provided by the rules of your Honorable Court, and said non-residents have failed and neglected to appear and answer said Bill of Complaint, although the time fixed by said Order of Publication has passed.

TO THE END, THEREFORE,

1st. That a Decree Pro Confesso may be taken against the said Defendants who have been regularly summoned as well as against the non-residents, Defendants, who have been informed of the object and substance of said Bill of Complaint by publication of an Order of Publication aforesaid.

2nd. And for such other and further relief as the case may require.
