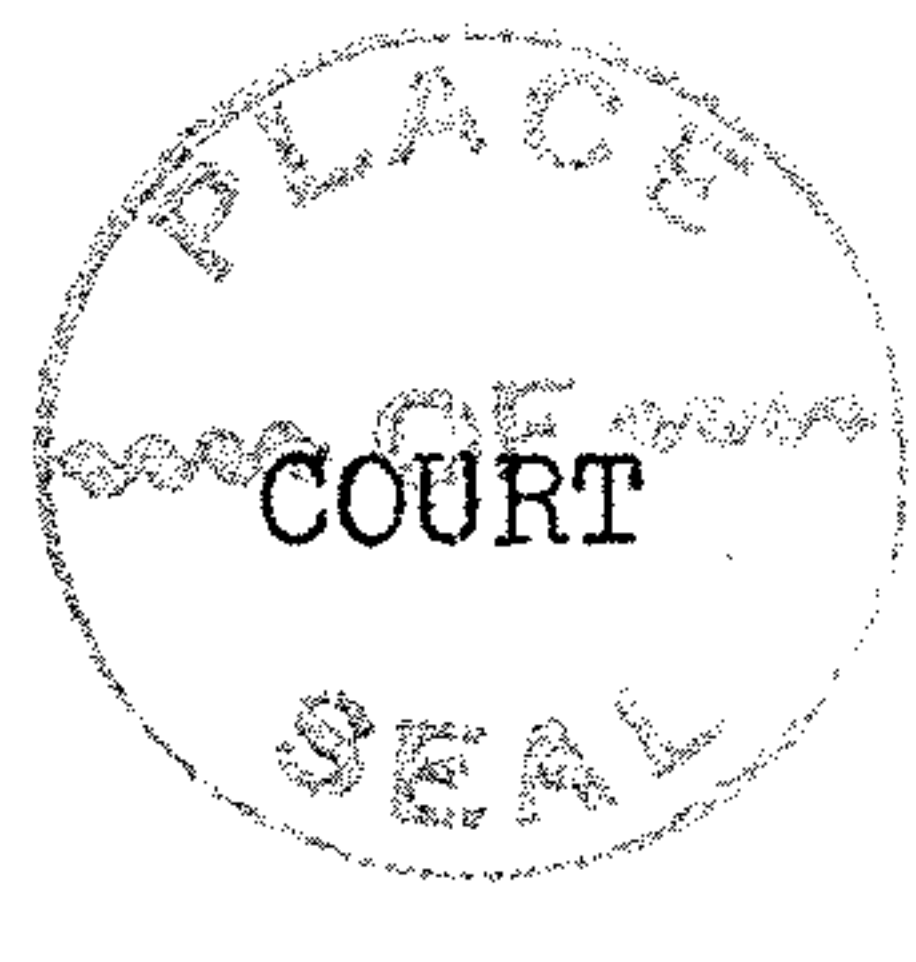

To the Honorable, the Judges of said Court:

The Petition of D. Princeton Buckey, Administrator of James C. Crum, deceased, respectfully shows:

1- That on the 16th day of August, 1932, your Petitioner was appointed Administrator of the estate of James C. Crum, deceased, and that your Petitioner has reported on the 21st day of November, 1932, all of the estate of the deceased, which is duly filed in your Honorable Court, consisting of: (a) Mortgage from Charles A. Garber and wife to James C. Crum and wife, (said wife having predeceased her husband) James C. Crum whereby the present interest in said mortgage belongs by the entirety to the estate of James C. Crum, the deceased, for the sum of \$3,000.00, upon which said mortgage has been paid the sum of Five Hundred Dollars, and the balance thereon being due to the estate of the said James C. Crum, the sum of \$2500.00 with interest from March 22, 1932, together with the taxes on said property, amounting to about \$112.50, with interest from October 1, 1932, and which said mortgage is dated the 22nd day of March, 1921, and is recorded in Liber 334, folio 70, one of the land Records of Frederick County, Maryland.
