

That the consideration for all the aforementioned deeds was the sum of One Dollar and the love and affection, and were conveyed by James O. Harne, the husband, unto his wife, Annie M. Harne.

5. That your Petitioners believe and is advised that the conveyances as aforesaid from James O. Harne to Annie M. Harne may have left an interest, dower or otherwise, in the said James O. Harne, which said interest of whatever kind it may be, your Petitioner further believes was devised unto the said Annie M. Harne by virtue of the last will and testament of the said James O. Harne hereinbefore referred to, and filed herewith, and your Petitioners file herewith as a part of this petition the deeds whereby the said James O. Harne became vested of the aforementioned real estate, as follows:

A. A part of all that real estate which was conveyed unto James O. Harne by Mary Delauder, et al, by deed dated May 22, 1905, the whole tract containing 44 5/8 acres of land, more or less, and said deed being recorded in Liber S. T. H. No. 276, Folio 83, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, a certified copy of which deed is filed herewith as a part hereof and marked Exhibit "H".

B. All that real estate containing 120 $\frac{1}{4}$  acres of land, more or less, which was conveyed unto James O. Harne by Samuel P. Bussard and Florence M. Bussard, his wife, by deed dated March 20, 1885, and recorded in Liber A. F. No. 11, Folio 7, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, a certified copy of which deed is filed herewith as a part hereof and marked Exhibit "I".

C. All that piece or parcel of land containing 36 $\frac{3}{4}$  acres of land, more or less, which was conveyed unto the said James O. Harne by Henry Show by deed dated November 11, 1889, and recorded in Liber W.I.P. No. 11, Folio 27, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, a certified copy of which deed is filed herewith as a part hereof and marked Exhibit "J".

D. All that piece or parcel of land containing 23 11/160 acres, more or less, which was conveyed unto the said James O. Harne by William Toms and Annie M. Toms, his wife, by deed dated June 1, 1898, and recorded in Liber D. H. H. No. 1, Folio 687, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, a certified copy of which deed is filed herewith as apart hereof and marked Exhibit "K".

E. All that real estate, containing 35 3/4 acres of land, more or less, which was conveyed unto the said James O. Harne by Benjamin Shuff, by deed dated June 3, 1895, and recorded in Liber J.L.J. No. 11, Folio 143, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, a certified copy of which deed is filed herewith as a part hereof and marked Exhibit "L".

F. All that real estate, containing 9 3/8 acres of land, more or less, which was conveyed unto the said James O. Harne by Benjamin Shuff, by deed dated June 3, 1895, and recorded in Liber J.L.J. No. 11, Folio 143, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, a certified copy of which deed is filed herewith as a part hereof and marked Exhibit "M".

G. All that real estate, containing 19 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres of land, more or less, which was conveyed unto the said James O. Harne by Cyrus C. Shuff and Sarah A. Shuff, his wife, by deed dated July 9, 1888, and recorded in Liber W.I.P. No. 11, Folio 27, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, a certified copy of which deed is filed herewith as a part hereof and marked Exhibit "N".

H. All that piece or parcel of real estate, containing 25 $\frac{1}{4}$  acres of land, more or less, which was conveyed unto the said James O. Harne by Joseph Stottlemyer and Martha A. R. Stottlemyer, his wife, by deed dated March 24, 1888, and recorded in Liber W. I. P. No. 6, Folio 126, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, a certified copy of which deed is filed herewith as a part hereof and marked Exhibit "O".
