This Deed made this 24th day of March in the year Eighteen hundred and Ninety three by John Kelbaugh and Mary S. E. Kelbaugh his wife of Frederick County and State of Maryland, Witness-
eth that in consideration of the sum of One hundred and twenty five dollars, the said John Kelbaugh and Mary S. E. Kelbaugh his wife do grant unto James O. Harne his heirs executors or assigns all of the following described parcels of land lying and being in Frederick County State of Maryland which is bounded as follows on the North West and South by the lands of Noah Eccard and on the East by the lands of S. M. Bussard it being the same that was formerly owned by George Zimmerman, conveyed by William H. Kelbaugh to John Kelbaugh by deed dated Oct. 22, 1877 containing twenty one acres of land more or less also all that lot or parcel of land situated in Frederick County and State of Maryland being the same land that was conveyed by deed bearing date February 4th 1882 from Peter H. Bussard and Martin T. Bussard to John Kelbaugh, described as follows:- Being part of a tract of land called "What you Please" Beginning for said lot at a stone at the beginning of the whole tract called "What you please" and running S 25° E 40 ps.
