

no need for your Honors to construe the said last will and testament, as the same is clear and unambiguous and free from repugnancy.

Answering the twelfth paragraph of the said bill, your respondents admit that all the parties to the proceedings are adults excepting the said Harry C. Kemp and Mary Kemp and Frederick, M. Kemp, who are infants under the age of Twenty-one years and the children of your respondents, Harry M. Kemp and Mattie Marcella Kemp, his wife, that the said Harry C. Kemp will attain the age of twenty years in the month of October, Nineteen Hundred and Thirty-one, and is supporting himself by his own labor away from his parent's home and in the City of Troy, State of New York, as above set out.

And your respondents demur so much of the bill as seeks a construction of the last will and testament of the said Anna S. Kemp, that is, to the seventh, eighth and eleventh paragraphs of the said bill of complaint, and say that the will is clear, unambiguous and free from repugnancy, and that there is no occasion for the construction of the said will by your Honorable Court, and second, that no equity is shown by the seventh, eighth, and eleventh paragraphs, and third, that said paragraphs are bad in substance and insufficient in law.

And for such other and further reasons as shall be made known at the hearing.

And having fully answered, your respondents ask to be dismissed with their reasonable costs.
