

WHEREFORE, your Petitioner prays your Honors to assume jurisdiction of the Trust above-mentioned, and to guide and direct him in the further execution of his duties as Trustee and to order that such notices as your Honors shall deem necessary shall be given to the creditors of the said Harry R. C. Arnold and Nellie E. Arnold, his wife, to file their claims, duly authenticated with the Clerk of your Honorable Court, on or before such time as your Honors shall designate, and to name the amount or penalty of the bond at this time to qualify as Trustee in said cause; and for such other and further relief as the nature and equity of the cause may require.

The foregoing Petition and exhibit thereto having by the Court been read and considered, It is thereupon this 12th day of May, A. D. 1921, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, and by the authority thereof, adjudged, ordered and decreed that this Court does hereby assume jurisdiction over the Trust created by the Deed of Trust bearing date on the 10th day of May, A. D. 1921, executed by Harry R. C. Arnold and Nellie E. Arnold, his wife, to Harry C. Hull, Trustee, and it is further adjudged, ordered and decreed that the said Harry C. Hull, as Trustee, file an approved bond with a bonding company as surety thereon in the penalty of \$3000.00, and that he give at least three weeks notice to the creditors of Harry R. C. Arnold and Nellie E. Arnold, his wife, by advertisement once a week for three successive weeks in some newspaper published in Frederick County, to file their claims duly authenticated, with the clerk of this court, on or before some day certain to be named in said notice.

"EXHIBIT A"

This Deed, made this 10th day of May, A. D. 1921, by Harry R. C. Arnold and Nellie E. Arnold, his wife, both of Frederick County, State of Maryland;

WHEREAS, the said Harry R. C. Arnold and Nellie E. Arnold, his wife, are indebted unto sundry persons in various sums of money which they are unable, forthwith, to pay in full and desire to convey and assign all their property and estate to Harry C. Hull, in trust for the equal benefit of all their creditors, as hereinafter set forth; NOW, THEREFORE, THIS DEED WITNESSETH: That in consideration of the premises and the sum of Five dollars (\$5.00) the said Harry R. C. Arnold and Nellie E. Arnold, his wife, do hereby grant and convey, bargain and sell, transfer and assign, unto the said Harry C. Hull, as trustee, all of their real estate and personal property, of every kind, nature and description, wheresoever situated, to-wit:

First: All that real estate consisting of One hundred Thirty seven acres, more or less, together with the improvements thereon, situate, lying and being in New Market District, in Frederick County, State of Maryland, it being the same real estate that was conveyed to the aforesaid Harry R. C. Arnold by deed from George L. Kauffman et al., dated September 23, 1918, and duly recorded in Liber No. 326, Folio 144 etc., one of the Land Records of Frederick County.

Second: Also, all the personal property and estate to them, the aforesaid Harry R. C. Arnold and Nellie E. Arnold, his wife, belonging, including live-stock, farming implements, moneys, debts, promissory notes, bills receivable, contracts, assets and demands and all other property and estate, real, personal or mixed, either at law or in Equity, to them, the said Harry R. C. Arnold and Nellie E. Arnold, his wife, belonging, wheresoever the same may be located, exempting, however, the necessary wearing apparel of them, the said Harry R. C. Arnold and Nellie E. Arnold, his wife, and such property as may be by law except from execution.
