TO THE HONORABLE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

Your Oratrix, complaining, says:-

1. That a certain Harlan P. Stotemyer, late of Frederick County, Maryland, departed this life testate on or about the 14th day of December, A. D. 1931, being seized and possessed of certain real estate, situated in Catoctin Election District, in Frederick County, Maryland, more particularly described as follows:

All those parcels of land and premises granted and conveyed unto the said Harlan P. Stotemyer, deceased, by Emory L. Coblentz and Ira E. Pryor, attorneys in fact, et al., by deed dated July 2, 1906, and duly recorded in Liber S.T.H. No. 278, folio 539, etc., one of the Land Records of Frederick County, Maryland, said Lots being known as Lots Nos. 1, 4, 5, and 9, beginning respectively:-

Lot No.1, at a stone at the end of the 3rd line of a deed from Benjamin Shuff and wife to William Hauver of which this is a part, said deed being recorded in Liber T. G. No. 5, folio 681, &c., one of the Land Records of Frederick County, and running thence with the outlines thereof N. 15 Degrees, E. 55.5 perches; N. 40 degrees, W. 20 perches; N. 16 degrees, E. 5.5 perches; S. 79 degrees, E. 42 perches; S. 30 Deg. E. 14 perches; S. 11 Deg., W. 20 perches; S. 30 Deg. E. 12 perches; S. 60 Deg. W. 58 perches, to intersect said third line of aforesaid deed, thence with it N. 33.5 deg., W. 8 perches, to the place of beginning, containing 17 acres, 1 Rood and 20 Perches of land, more or less.

Lot No. 4, at the end of the 8th line of said deed from Benjamin Shuff and wife to William Hauver, it being also the end of the 18th line of the original tract called "The Three Miserable Knobs" and running thence N. 77 deg., W. 108 perches to intersect the 9th line of Lot No. 1, thence with said 8th line reversed N. 60 deg., E. 7.75 perches, thence with the 2nd, 3rd and 4th lines of Lot No. 3 reversed N. 67 deg., E. 10.5 perches, N. 25 deg. 33.75 perches, N. 61 deg., E. 25.5 perches, thence S. 36 deg. E. 89 perches to place of beginning, containing 20 Acres, 1 Road and 20 Perches of land, more or less."

Lot No. 5, at same place as Lot No. 4, and running with the 9th line of said deed S. 8 deg. W. 30.5 perches, thence N. 70 deg. W. 126.75 perches to intersect the 8th line of Lot No. 1, thence with said 8th line reversed N. 60 deg. E. 25.5 perches to the end of the first line of Lot No. 4, and with it reversed, S. 77 deg., E. 108 perches to place of beginning, containing 19 Acres, 2 Roods and 20 perches of land, more or less.

Lot No. 9 at the end of the 15th line of said deed from Shuff and wife to William
