

Stotelmyer, a brother, died leaving: his widow, Anna; and that all of the parties in interest are adults above the age 21 years.

The bill further states that the said real estate can not be divided among the parties in interest without loss and injury and that it would be to the advantage of all of the parties to this cause that the said real estate be sold and after the payment of the costs and expenses that the remainder be divided among the parties according to their several rights and interests; that the said lots of land are in a run-down condition and they are subject to be sold for taxes and that neither the complainant nor any party in interest feels justified in paying said taxes or making further effort to maintain the said tracts of land in their present condition.

The bill prays for a decree for the sale of the said real estate by a trustee or trustees to be appointed by the Court and that the proceeds of the sale be distributed to the parties in interest under the orders of the Court.

It is thereupon ordered this 19th day of August, 1932 by the Circuit Court for Frederick County and by the authority thereof that the complainant, Elizabeth C. Stotelmyer, widow, by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper published in the said Frederick County, once a week for four successive weeks, prior to the 19th day of September 1932, give notice to said non-resident defendants, viz., Daniel E. Stotelmyer, Elizabeth Stotelmyer, Dwight Stotelmyer, Ruth Stotelmyer, Hubert Stotelmyer, Blanche Stotelmyer, Byrd Stotelmyer, Mrs. Byrd Stotelmyer, in the State of Pennsylvania; Mildred McFarland and Earnest McFarland, of the State of Virginia; Sarah Stotelmyer and Otho F. Stotelmyer and Ethel Stotelmyer of the State of Indiana; Ona C. Stom and C. H. Stom, of the State of Michigan; Marvin Stotelmyer, address unknown; and Anna Stotelmyer, of the State of West Virginia; of the object and substance of this bill of complaint, and warning them to appear in this Court, either in person or by a solicitor, on or before the 15th day of October, 1932, and show cause, if any they have, why a decree ought not to be passed as prayed.
