It is thereupon, this 6 day of January, A. D. 1933, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, in Equity, ADJUDGED, ORDERED, and DECREED, that said bill of complaint be, and the said is hereby taken pro confesso against all of said defendants.

And it is further ordered that depositions be taken before one of the standing examiners of this Court, in support of the allegations of the bill.

ELIZABETH C. STOTELMYER, the Complainant in this cause, produced as a witness on her behalf, being first duly sworn, deposes and says as follows:

My name is Elizabeth C. Stotelmyer. I am the Complainant in this cause, I am 59 years of age. I reside at Wolfsville, in Catoclin District, Frederick County, Maryland, and have so resided all of my life.

I am the widow of Harlan P. Stotelmyer, who died testate on the 14th day of December, A. D. 1931. My late husband and I resided in the corner store property at Wolfsville, where I now reside and which property belongs to me. I offer herewith certified copy of the Last Will and Testament of my late husband as evidence in this case, marked "Exhibit B". I have filed my renunciation in the Orphans' Court, but will probably dismiss my renunciation and accept the provisions of the Will later.

My husband died seized and possessed of the land and premises described in the deed from Emory L. Coblenz and Ira E. Pryor, Attorneys in Fact, et al., dated July 2, 1906, and duly recorded in Liber S.T.H. No. 278, folio 539 etc., one of the Land Records of Frederick County, Maryland, said lots being known as lots Nos. 1, 4, 5 & 9, and particularly described in said deed, which I offer and filed herewith as evidence, marked "Exhibit A", said four lots being mountain lots with growing timber on them, containing respectively: 17 A's - 1 R.- 20 Pcs.; 20 A's - 1 R. - 20 Pcs.; 19 A's - 2 R - 20 Pcs.; 17 A's - 3 R - and 20 Pcs., of land, more or less and seized and possessed of all that part of a tract of land described in the deed
