PUBLIC SALE OF VALUABLE REAL ESTATE.

Zimmerman, widower, bearing date on the third day of August, 1929 and recorded in Liber No. 371, Folio 392, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, and duly assigned to me for the purpose of foreclosure, I, the undersigned, will sell at public sale at the Court House Door in Frederick City, Frederick County, Maryland, on SATURDAY, THE SEVENTEENTH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1932, at the hour of 11.30 o'clock a. m., the following described two farms, tracts or parcels of land situate, lying and being in Frederick County, State of Maryland.

First: All that farm or tract of land situate, lying and being in Buckeystown Election District of said County and State, containing 148 ACRES, 1 ROOD AND 29 SQUARE PERCHES OF LAND, more or less, situate at the intersection of the New Design road and the road from Ballenger Creek State road to Lime Kiln. Being the same land which was conveyed unto the said Raymond C. Putman and Bertha E. Putman, his wife, by J. Hanson Kepler and wife, by a deed bearing date on the third day of April, 1916 and recorded in Liber No. 316, Folio 369, one of the Land Records of Frederick County.

This property is improved by a TWELVE-ROOM BRICK HOUSE, of two and one-half stories with ten roof and cellar, a large bank barn approximately 72 by 45 feet with tin roof. There is also on the premises a number of small out buildings, consisting of corn-crib and wagon shed, a small barn and hog pen, a milk house and garage, a blacksmith shop, a stone meat house, chicken house and ice house and other out buildings. There is also a four room tenant house on the property. The whole is one of the fine farms of Frederick County.
