

The bill then prays for a decree for the sale of the said real estate and improvements thereon, by a trustee to be appointed by the Court and that the proceeds be applied to the payment of the complainants lien and the interest thereon, and for general relief.

It is thereupon, ordered this 2nd day of August, 1932, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting in Equity and by the authority thereof, that the complainants, William F. Cover and Carroll W. Cover, partners trading as William F. Cover and Son, by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in somenewspaper published in said Frederick County, once a week for cour successive weeks, prior to the 1st day of September, 1932, give notice to said defendant corporation, the Miller Construction Company, of the object and substance of this bill of complaint, and warningit to appear in this Court, by its officers or solicitor, on or before the 17th day of September, 1932, to show cause, if any it has, why a decree ought not to be passed as prayed.
