

Q. Do you know the amount of it?

A. Yes, sir, and she came to see me.

Q. Did you ever hear her speak of any other money or property she had in any way?

A. No, sir.

Q. What was the date of her death?

A. December 1, 1932.

Q. Do you know of any other debts that she owes?

A. A doctor bill and tombstones, that is all.

Q. Who was the doctor?

A. Dr. Horine, from Brunswick.

Q. How much is that bill?

A. \$20.00.

Q. And the tombstones.

A. \$60.00.

Q. Who is that due to?

A. Mr. Boileau, of Middletown.

Q. How about the funeral bill?

A. That is paid, and I paid that out of my own money.

Q. How much was that?

A. \$250.00.

Q. Do you have the receipted bill for that?

A. Yes, I have it at home.

Q. To whom was that paid?

A. Mr. C. T. K. Gladhill.

Q. How come you to pay that bill?

A. I wanted to straighten it up and I took my money and straightened it up.

Q. Did you have any agreement to pay the funeral bill of Mrs. O'Keefe?

A. No, sir, just paid it myself.

Q. Do you expect to be reimbursed for that?

A. Yes, I do.

Q. From your view of the situation, is there sufficient money to pay the debts without the sale of this property, this real estate?

A. No, it will have to come out of the property.
