

- Q. What money did she have in the house at the time of her death?
- A. She only had a little bit, and I used that to live on when I was there.
- Q. How much did you use to live on?
- A. About \$10.00.
- Q. Did you report that in Court as belonging to your mother?
- A. I used it to live on. What was her and I going to live on?
- Q. Was it more than \$10.00?
- A. No, that is all.
- Q. Where is the furniture now?
- A. Still there.
- Q. And the articles you claim, are they still there?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Nothing has been done as far as the furniture in the house is concerned?
- A. No, sir.
- Q. How much money do you owe your mother?
- A, I refuse to answer the question.
- To the General Interrogatory:
- A. Nothing further.

CHARLES A. WARNER, the Plaintiff, produced in his own behalf, being first duly sworn, deposes and says as follows:-

(Questions by Mr. Leslie N. Coblentz)

- Q. Your name is Charles A. Warner.
- A. Yes.
- Q. How old are you?
- A. Sixty-three.
- Q. What is your address?
- A. Blue Ridge Summit, Pennsylvania.
- Q. Did you know Mary O'Keefe during her lifetime?
- A. I knew her ever since I have been married, since 1897.
- Q. Your wife is from Burkittsville, I believe.
- A. Yes.
- Q. Are you or Mrs. Warner related to Mrs. O'Keefe?
- A. None whatever. Mrs. O'Keefe worked for my wife's family ever since I was a baby.
- Q. Mr. Warner, was Mrs. O'Keefe indebted to you during her lifetime?
- A. No, sir.
- Q. Didn't owe you any money?
- A. Only this judgment I put on.
- Q. Is this a copy of the judgment?
- A. Yes.

- Q. What is the amount of that?
- A. \$238.66, and interest as shown on the judgment.
- Q. To whom was that money given; who borrowed the money from you?
- A. Mr. Harbaugh, Mrs. Harbaugh's husband, when living.
- Q. And Mrs. O'Keefe went on the note at the time?
- A. She knew it at the time and said she would make it right, but I told her I wouldn't as long as she lived ask her for it and she could settle it after her death. She said, "I only want enough money to see me out."
- Q. When you made this loan to Mr. Harbaugh, did Mrs. O'Keefe go on the note at that time?
- A. No, she wasn't on the note.
