Q. Did you find any of that property you brought over from the Harbaugh home at the O'Keefe home after Mrs. O'Keefe's death?

A. Yes, it is still there.

Q. What would you estimate to be the value of this property that you brought in from the Harbaugh home?

A. It would be a little hard to say, \$25.00 or \$30.00, maybe not that much.

Q. Do you know about these other debts of the estate, that is, the funeral expenses?

A. No, I couldn't tell you.

Q. You know them generally but not specifically.

A. I know about them, but I never saw the funeral bill and never saw the tombstone bill.
