

3. That a portion of said trust property consists of horses, cattle and other live stock that will need daily care and attention, and also provender and feed with which to maintain them until a sale can be made;

4. That a portion of said trust property is two tracts of land containing in all approximately 310 acres, consisting of two farms, the one farm being now leased by a tenant who is farming the said farm for a one-half share of the products, and the other has been under the supervision of the said Charles H. Krise, and the said farm will need supervision and attention necessary for the planting, cultivating and harvesting of this year's crops.

5. That there are a large number of creditors of the said Charles H. Krise who should be notified to file their claims duly authenticated in order that they may participate in the distribution of said trust estate, and it is desirable that your Honorable Court should take cognizance of said trust and authorize your Trustees to employ someone to take care of said livestock and other property until a sale of the same can be made, and to empower your Trustees to purchase the necessary feed for said stock in the meantime, to empower your Trustees to hire laborers for planting, cultivating and harvesting the crops on the farm hereinbefore mentioned, and also to direct your Trustees to give the usual notice to creditors and that your Trustees may have such other and further relief as the nature of the case may require, and they therefore pray your Honors to pass an order accordingly.

This DEED OF TRUST, made this 10th day of May, in the year Nineteen hundred and Twenty-two, by me, Charles H. Krise, of Frederick County, State of Maryland,

WITNESSETH: Whereas the said Charles H. Krise is now indebted unto sundry parties, persons and corporations in several sums of money, and being unable to pay the same in full, has proposed to assign all of his property unto Leslie N. Coblentz, Charles C. Waters, and William I. Renner, all of Frederick County, State of Maryland, in trust for the equal benefit of all of his creditors as hereinafter mentioned,

NOW, THEREFORE, In Consideration of the premises and the payment of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) by the said Leslie N. Coblentz, Charles C. Waters and William I. Renner, unto the said Charles H. Krise, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, I, the said Charles H. Krise, do hereby grant, convey, bargain and sell unto Leslie N. Coblentz, Charles C. Waters and William I. Renner, as Trustees, all the following described property;

(1st) All that piece or parcel of land situate, lying and being in Frederick County, State of Maryland, 1½ miles Northwest of Rocky Ridge, being all the same property which was conveyed unto the said Charles H. Krise by Reno S. Harp and H. Dorsey Etchison, Trustees, by
