TO THE HONORABLE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The Petition of EDITH W. MAIN AND LEO WEINBERG, Trustees, respectfully shows:

FIRST: That, as Trustees, they have given bond with the AMERICAN BONDING COMPANY, as surety.

SECOND: That the annual premium on this bond is TWENTY-SIX DOLLARS AND SIXTY-SIX (\$26.66) CENTS, and the payment of the same, is an item of expense, that, in view of the depletion of the estate, should now be eliminated.

THIRD: That, as shown, by the Third Account, filed herein August 5, 1921, the only assets of this estate consist of the sum of FIFTY-NINE DOLLARS AND FORTY-SIX (\$59.46) CENTS in cash; four shares of the Capital Stock of the Citizens' National Bank, Frederick, Maryland, and three dwelling houses.

FOURTH: That since said time two shares of the Capital Stock of the Citizens' National Bank have been sold, and, at the present time, the value of the estate is, approximately, \$7500.00.

FIFTH: That the said Third Account has been duly ratified and confirmed, as per this Court's Order of August 20, 1921.

SIXTH: That your Petitioners desire to substitute, for the present bond, a personal bond, with approved security, in such penalty as this Court may designate.
