The Bill of Complaint of The Thurmont Bank, a body corporate, duly incorporated under the Laws of the State of Maryland, respectfully shows unto your Honors:

1. That George M. Eichelberger, departed this life on or about March 24, 1934, intestate and letters of administration upon his estate were duly granted by the Orphan's Court for Frederick County, on the 3d day of July, 1934 to the above named Emma E. Eichelberger, Administratrix and your Orator files herewith as part hereof marked "Complainant's Exhibit No. 1" a certified copy of said letters of administration.

2. That at the time of his death, the above named George M. Eichelberger was indebted to Your Orator on a certain judgment and certain promissory notes as follows:

Judgment for \$1200.00 and \$26.45 costs with interest from July 25, 1932
 Promissory note for \$90.00 with interest from December 26, 1933
 Promissory note for \$36.00 with interest from January 26, 1934
 Promissory note for \$135.00 with interest from March 6, 1934
 Promissory note for \$60.00 with interest from March 17, 1934
 Promissory note for \$45.00 with interest from March 8, 1934
 Promissory note for \$60.00 with interest from December 26, 1933

4. That the said George M. Eichelberger, at the time of his death, was seized of certain real estate located in Frederick county containing one hundred, two and three quarter (102 3/4) acres of land, more or less, and particularly described in a deed to the said George M. Eichelberger from Joseph H. W. Fyck and Margaret R. Fick, his wife, dated March 9, 1883, and recorded among the Land Records of Frederick County in Liber A. F. No. 7, folio 127, to which deed reference is hereby made for a full and particular description of said tract of land, and your Orator files herewith as part hereof a certified copy of said deed marked "Complainant's Exhibit No. 3", saving and accepting therefrom a certain part of said tract of land, the same containing five and three quarter (5 3/4) acres, more or less, and particularly described in a deed from the said George M. Eichelberger and Emma E. Eichelberger, his wife, to Sarah C. Eyler, dated March 31, 1908, and recorded among the Land Records of Frederick County in Liber S. T. H. No. 282, folio 395, to which deed reference is hereby made for a full and particular description of said tract of land and your Orator files herewith as "Complainant's Exhibit No. 2" a certified copy of said deed.

5. That the said George M. Eichelberger left surviving him his widow, Emma E. Eichelberger and the following children: George M.
