who intermarried with Lulu Eichelberger; and the said George M. Eichelberger did not leave surviving him any other children or any descendants of any deceased children and the said Widow and surviving children constitute all of the heirs-at-law of the said George M. Eichelberger, deceased.

6. That the said George M. Eichelberger did not leave personal estate sufficient to pay his debts and the cost of administration of said estate and your Orator, being a creditor of the said George M. Eichelberger in the amount of Sixteen Hundred and fifty-two 46/100 dollars, (\$1642.46/100) with interest, representing the balance due it on the indebtedness hereinabove set out, avers that it is entitled to have the real estate of which the said George M. Eichelberger died seized and hereinabove referred to, sold to pay the indebtedness due your Orator and the other creditors of the said George M. Eichelberger, deceased.

WHEREFORE YOUR ORATOR PRAYS:

A. That a decree may be passed herein for the sale of the real estate of which the said George M. Eichelberger died seized for the purpose of paying the indebtedness due your Orator and other creditors, and

B. That any excess may be properly distributed among those legally entitled thereto.

C. That a trustee may be appointed by this Court to make such sale, and

D. That your Orator may have such other and further relief as its case may require.

May it please your Honor to grant unto your Orator the State's Writ of Subpoena directed to the said Defendants, Raymond E. Eichelberger, Widower; John D. Eichelberger and Edna V. Eichelberger; his wife; Elizabeth E. Esanogle and Harry N. Isanogle, her husband; Nellie A. Heim and Charles E. Heim, her husband; Bessie M. Martin and Calvin Martin, her husband; Rubie M. Fisher and Charles L. Fisher, her husband; and Martin S. Eichelberger and Lulu Eichelberger his wife, all residents of Frederick County, State of Maryland, commanding them and each of them to be and appear in this Court on some day certain to be herein named and answer this Bill of Complaint, and abide by and perform such order or decree as may be passed in the premises; and may it please your Honor to grant unto your Orator an Order of Publication against the said George M. Eichelberger and Ella Eichelberger, his wife, non-residents of the State of Maryland who reside in York County, Pennsylvania, advising them and each of them of the purposes and objects of said Bill of Complaint and commanding them and each of them to be and appear in this Court on some day certain to be named in said Order of Publication to abide by and perform such order or decree as may be passed herein.
