3. That they admit the allegations contained in the 4th and 5th paragraphs of said Bill.
4. That they admit that the said George M. Eichelberger did not leave personal estate sufficient to pay his debts and the costs of the Administration of said estate and that the said Complainant was a creditor of the said George M. Eichelberger, deceased, but they are uncertain as to the amount and leave this as a matter of proof.
5. Further answering said Bill of Complaint and all other parts thereof, these Respondents consent that the real estate of which the said George M. Eichelberger, dies seized and possessed shall be sold at public sale, requesting representation in the Trusteeship, so that the proceeds may be available with which to pay the preferred claims and debts of the said George M. Eichelberger and reserving unto themselves individually all rights in and to the remaining proceeds of said sale.

WHEREFORE having fully answered the said Bill of Complaint these Respondents pray to be hence dismissed with their proper costs.
