The above cause standing ready for a hearing, and being submitted, the Bill, Answer, Exhibits Testimony, and all other proceedings were by the Court read and considered.

It is thereupon, this 30th day of April in the year nineteen hundred and thirty-five by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, as a Court of Equity, and by the authority of said Court, adjudged, ordered and decreed, that the land and premises mentioned in these proceedings be sold and that William M. Storm, Leslie N. Coblentz and Sherman P. Bowers of Frederick County, be, and they, are hereby appointed Trustee to make the said sales, and that the course and manner of their proceedings shall be as follows: They shall first file in the Clerk's office
