Q. Have you given him all of the credits he has made since he has given you that note?

A. I have given him all of the credits.

Q. How did he pay?

A. \$15.00 in money that he got from his mother's estate and \$45.00 which was a part of the half interest of the wheat crop.

Q. Did you ask him to give you that note for something over \$400.00 saying "that might benefit him in the future?"

A. No. I have a note dated July 1, 1929, signed by Ezra P. Horton, and Mary E. Horton, his wife, for the amount of \$274.06 and I have another note signed by Ezra Horton and Ida Horton, his mother, and witnessed by Mrs. David Ecker, his daughter, dated April 12, 1933, in the sum of \$388.87. I file these two notes marked Exhibit "Note 1" and "Note 2".

Q. When this note was given upon which judgment was entered, as shown by Exhibit "T. H. L." was there any additional amount due to this note marked "Exhibit 2"?

A. Yes.

Q. Making up what amount?

A. \$463.70. The reason I retained note (Exhibit Note 1), is because I had his wife's signature Mary E. Horton, on the note, who has since left her husband and I retained note (Exhibit Note 2) which I have herewith filed because Ezra P. Horton and his mother Ida Horton were on this note and then for additional services I took the note which is represented by the Exhibit "T.H.L." and the full amount of which is due and owing to me as I have above set forth in detail.

CROSS EXAMINATION

Questions by Mr. Bowers

Q. Dr. Legg, this note of July 1, 1929, Exhibit "Note 1", signed by Ezra P. Horton and Mary E. Horton, was given to you for what?

A. Professional services rendered Ezra P. Horton, his wife and two children.

Q. And the note of April 12, 1933, Exhibit "Note 2" in the sum of \$388.87, signed by Ezra P. Horton, and Ida Horton, was for what?

A. the same obligation as mentioned in "Note 1" plus additional professional services rendered by me to Ezra P. Horton and his mother Ida Horton and for which Ezra Horton undertook to stand good for.

Q. And the note for which judgment was obtained, was for what?

A. It included the same two previous notes plus services rendered to Ida Horton, mother of Ezra Horton and for which Mr. Horton undertook to stand good.

Q. Dr. Legg, did you keep a book record of your services in detail both to Ezra Horton and family and the family of Ida Horton?

A. I have.

Q. Do your book entries show this amount to be due as you have just testified in response to Mr. Buckley's questions as the amount to be due under the judgment?

A. They do.
