The object of this suit is to procure a decree for the sale of certain real estate in Urbana District, Frederick County, Maryland, of which Jacob Makel, died, seized and possessed that the proceeds arising therefrom may be applied to the payment of his debts and funeral expenses.

The Bill states that the said Jacob Makel was in his lifetime indebted to the complainant Robert, Makel, his son, in the sum of Three Hundred and Sixty Dollars and the decedent's estate is indebted to him in the sum of One Hundred and Seventy-four Dollars and One Cent, funeral expenses. paid by him.

That the said Jacob Makel departed this life on April 9th 1929 without any personal property whatsoever but seized and possessed of a part of a tract of land in Urbana District, Frederick County, Maryland, called "Wet Work Resurveyed" containing ten acres of land, more or less, it being fully described in a deed from Edward Baker, Administrator, to the said Jacob Makel dated October 7th, A.D. 1892, and recorded in Liber J. L. J. NO. 3, folio 243, etc. one of the Land Records of Frederick, ^{County} Maryland, ^{and} leaving as his only heirs at law a grandson, Jacob Makel infant, who resides at Lime Kiln, Frederick County, Maryland, a daughter, Cora Hill, who intermarried with John Hill both of whom reside at Hopeland, Frederick County, Maryland, and the following non-resident children and grandchildren, a daughter, Ruth Makel who intermarried with _____ Belfield, both of whom reside in New York City, New York, State, a daughter Annie Makel who intermarried with _____ Wilson, both of whom reside in Boston, State of Massachusetts, a son Charles Makel, widower, who resides in Detroit, State of Michigan, a son Robert Makel, unmarried, who formerly lived at Atlantic City, State of New Jersey, but now a resident of the City of Washington, District of Columbia, Kate Makel Howard, widow, who intermarried with Frank Makel, a son, Wilson Makel, a grandson, Joseph Makel, a grandson, all of whom reside in Pittsburgh, State of Pennsylvania, a granddaughter, Carrie Gibson, and _____ Gibson, her husband, who resides in Boston, State of Massachusetts, a grandson Montgomery Thomas, who resides in the City of Washington, District of Columbia, a son-in-law Lewis Salisbury, who intermarried with Della Makel, deceased, and their children, Alice
