That on order of publication giving notice to the said Ruth Belfield and _____ Belfield, her husband, Annie Wilson and _____ Wilson, her husband, Charles Makel, Kate Makel Howard, Joseph Makel and Wilson Makel, infants, Carrie Gibson, and _____ Gibson, her husband, Montgomery Thomas and Lewis Salisbury, Alice Salisbury and Ruth Salisbury, adults, and Harvey Salisbury, Dora Salisbury and Mary Salisbury, infants, all of whom are non-residents as aforesaid, of the substance and object of this bill and warning them and each of them to appear in this Court, in person, or by solicitor, on or before a certain day to answer the premises and show cause, if any they have why a decree ought not to pass as prayed; and also a writ of subpoena, directed to the Sheriff of Frederick County against the said Jacob Makel, infant, Cora Hill and John Hill, her husband, all of whom reside in Frederick County, Maryland, commanding them and each of them to appear in this Court at some certain day to be named therein to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as be passed therein as prayed.
