- 4- That the check given in settlement was promptly deposited in the Citizens National Bank of Frederick for collection, but was not and has not been collected due to certain restrictions placed upon the Peoples National Bank of Brunswick.
- 5- That these Trustees assent and agree to a Decree being passed by your Honorable Court rescinding the ratification of said sale, provided the said Charles C. James and wife execute a deed reconveying the real estate unto your Trustees.
- 6- That said Trustees believe the said Charles C. James acted in good faith in making his arrangements for the purchase of said farm.
