

- Q. Mr. Albaugh, your name is -- A. Maurice J. Albaugh
- Q. What position do you occupy with the Woodsboro Savings Bank? A. Cashier.
- Q. Do you know Milton D. Bowers? A. Yes, Sir.
- Q. Is he alive or dead? A. Dead
- Q. Did he leave a will? A. Not that I know of.
- Q. At the time of his death was he indebted to the Woodsboro Savings Bank in any sum of money? A. Yes.
- Q. In what amount, if any, Mr. Albaugh? A. Principal amount, \$808.43, and interest to date, \$69.54.
- Q. I hand you a paper marked Exhibit No. 1, Will you tell the Court what that is? A. It is a confessed judgment of \$808.43, that we had against the land of Mr. Bowers, still open. We haven't received payment yet.
- Q. What children, if any, did Mr. Bowers leave? A. He left three children as far as I know: two sons and one daughter.
- Q. And the sons are named what? A. One son is Paul, and Allen S. Bowers, and the daughter's name is Marie, She married a Blessing.
- Q. What Blessing did she marry? A. Frank Blessing, I think.
- Q. Are they all of age? A. Yes, sir.
- Q. All over 21? A. All of age, yes, sir.
- Q. What is the name of the wife of Paul Bowers? A. I don't know her name, I believe it was Marie. I wouldn't say for sure, I know the one's wife's name is Miriam Bowers.
- Q. That is the wife of Allen Bowers? A. Allen Bower's wife, yes, sir.
- Q. Paul Bowers and his wife, were answered by Mr. Wood. Mr. Albaugh, what, if anything, was done with the estate of Mr. Bowers? Did any one qualify as administrator? A. Allen did, yes.
- Q. I hand you paper marked Exhibit No. 2. Will you tell the Court what that is? A. This is a letter from the Court that Allen Bowers administered on the estate of Milton Bowers.
- Q. I hand you paper marked Exhibit No. 3. Would you tell the Court if you please, what that is? A. That is the appraisal of personal property of Mr. and Mrs. Bowers.
- Q. And what amount is that? A. \$189.55
- (Exhibits 1,2,3,and 4, the latter being the will under which Mr. Bowers, acquired title to this property, all having been filed with the bill of complaint, offered and filed in evidence).
- Q. Mr. Albaugh, do you know of any other personal property of Mr. Bowers in addition to the inventory which was filed? A. No, sir.
- Q. Now you know this tract of land? A. Yes, sir.
- Q. What does it consist of? A. I don't know exactly the number of acres, but there's a house and a barn and about 50 acres.
- Q. Do you know from whom he got the property? A. Well he's had it for a long time, I think it came from his parents.
- Q. What was their name? A. I don't know.
- Q. Is this a description of the property in Exhibit No. 4? A. Yes, I think so, yes, sir.
- Q. What is the value of this property, Mr. Albaugh? A. I would say \$1500.
- Q. Do you know whether or not since Milton Bowers' death the property was put up for sale? A. It was, yes.
- Q. And it brought what, do you know? A. I think it was \$1625. I think so. I am not sure of that.
- Q. Why wasn't it conveyed, if you know? A. The heirs were going to sell it and for some reason or other one of them wouldn't sign the deed. They all signed except one.
- Q. Would you state whether or not, it is necessary to sell this property in order to pay the claim of the bank? A. Yes, sir.
