This Deed made this 17th day of April in the year Eighteen Hundred and Ninety four by me Rosa A. Williar of Frederick County in the State of Maryland, Witnesseth, that in consideration of the sum of Six Thousand nine hundred and Seventeen dollars and ninety two cents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged I, the said Rosa A. Williar do grant in fee simple unto Jacob O. Williar of said County and State, all those tracts of land situated in Frederick County, Maryland, described as follows: First all those parts of tracts of land called "William's Beginning" and "Poole's Industry" which were conveyed by deed from William A. Dorsey to said Augustus H. Williar dated on the first day of October in the year Eighteen hundred and sixty two and recorded in Liber B. G. F. No. 8, folio 353 &c., one of the Land Records of Frederick County containing one hundred and sixty two acres, three roods and thirty two square perches more or less, also the road or right of way therein described, being the same road as conveyed by Mary Poole to said William A. Dorsey by deed dated on the eleventh day of December A.D. 1850 recorded in Liber W. B. T. No. 12, folio 660 &c., one of the Land Records of Frederick County, and being three fourths of a perch wide, the center of it commencing at the end of a thirty eight perches on the fourth line of said deed from Mary Poole to said William A. Dorsey and running thence south thirty eight and one half degrees west seventy two perches to a stone, South one and one half degrees West thirty perches to a stone, South thirteen degrees, East thirty and one half perches to a stone in the public road.

Secondly all that land conveyed by Jonas Urner and wife, to said Augustus H. Williar by and under the name Augustus Williard dated on the thirteenth day of September A.D. 1877, and recorded in Liber T. G. No. 8, folio 430 &c., one of the Land Records of Frederick County, containing two acres, and two square perches of land, more or less, all the land hereby conveyed being the same land that was conveyed by Peter G. Sauble and Jacob O. Williar Executors of the Last Will of Augustus H. Williar late of Frederick County, deceased, to Rosa A. Williar by deed dated on the sixteenth day of April in the year Eighteen Hundred and ninety four and intended to be recorded in the Land Records of Frederick County, simultaneously with or just prior to the record of this deed.
